Coeliac UK welcomes Government's continued support of key Gluten Free staples on Prescription

On the 1st February, CUK received notice on the Government's decision to retain access to gluten free breads and flour mixes on prescription in England. This decision applies to everybody medically diagnosed with coeliac disease and recognises the need for people to have ongoing support in sticking to a lifelong gluten free diet. The proposal that there should be no access to gluten free products in primary care is therefore rejected by the government.

Although it does not necessarily follow that those CCG's who have stopped prescribing gluten free bread and flour mixes will now start doing so, it does put pressure on them to reassess the situation. We are awaiting the decision from West Kent CCG.
