"Provision of gluten free food and sufficient information for Coeliacs needs improvement.

As a long term inpatient in 2018 and 2019 with Coeliac Disease and continuous diarrhoea, it was imperative a gluten free diet was strictly followed.

The hospital menu cards have diet codes for many choices but lack relevant information for the well- being of Coeliacs. The breakfast menu does not list one GF item. When staff were advised, they were helpful and were able to supply some items but this then raised the question: Is this slice of bread definitely GF as, if not, it will cause further diarrhoea.

The lunch time menu raised other points, as the dietitian advised me to choose the less fibrous meals. The cards listed all vegetables with HC (healthy choice)

etc but none as GF, despite all vegetables being GF in their natural state. On occasions, where I added boiled potatoes, they were not supplied as they were not listed as GF.

The sweet course and the supper menus were the same, no GF listing on most items. I enclose a sample menu card for the three daily meals chosen at random.

This is not meant as a complaint but, as a member of the Coeliac Society, it serves as a constructive suggestion that, when the menu cards are next updated, further consideration should be given to the importance of diet to Coeliacs."
