Annual General Meeting

This will be held on Saturday 19th March at St. Mary's Church and Conference Centre, Bramall Lane, Sheffield S2 4QZ. The Summerhouse is a new restaurant next to Dore Station which has a fantastic range of gluten-free items on the menu. They are all clearly marked with some interesting dishes and puddings plus GF bread. **The Farm Shop** at the corner of Montrose Road and Carterknowle Road, Ecclesall has a good selection of gluten-free products.

Eyam Tea Rooms, The Square, Eyam, Derbyshire S32 5RB – have a separate gluten-free menu for All Day Breakfasts with GF sausage and toast, Lunches (with GF bread), Desserts and Snacks.
