The Article highlights that our grandparents' grain was not sprayed with pesticides. These days it is common practice among nonorganic farmers to spray their crops days before the harvest with the controversial pesticide glyphosate, to dry off the crop for processing.

In the factory, heavily automated bakery conglomerates have reduced the need for most of the human time, effort and craftsmanship used previously in the bread-making process through the use of a chemistry of additives and undisclosed processing aids.


