Annual review appointments

We get asked by members why some of you do not have annual reviews. This is down to your GP, who should be reviewing all patients with a lifelong condition annually. As part of this, some patients will be seen by the GP themselves and others will be referred to a dietitian at a hospital, or even a gastroenterologist.

Your committee has worked hard with St Richard's and Worthing Hospital in setting up annual review days for those of you who have annual check-ups with the dietitians. Both hospitals now have 2 sessions per year. If you are called for an annual review appointment at one of the sessions, please do your best to keep the appointment.

The sessions are becoming very successful and are a good way to combine getting your dietitian check with the opportunity to meet other people with coeliac disease, gluten free food suppliers, plus representatives from your local group, all of whom are present on the day. The consultation with a dietitian is in confidence and private.

Fish & chips in Worthing

Jacqui Keech let us know that "In August I was able to sit on the Worthing beach and eat fish & chips out of paper for the first time in 16 years! (since being diagnosed)

This exciting event was made possible by the Broadwater Fish & Chip shop in Broadwater (near the co-op). The owner was extremely particular with my gluten free part of my order; he was cooking separately for me when someone added 'normal' fish to the fryer and so he started again! The service and food was amazing - we even went back the following week to make the most of the summer weather this year. I enjoyed the plaice which was coated with a g/f batter, it was delicious!

I would like to recommend other coeliac's to give this a try."

100% gluten free Inn

Richard Stanfield passed on information about the Compass Inn at Cadnam which is just the other side of Southampton. Bit of a trek but if you're travelling in that direction, might be useful to know.

They advertise that they are the first pub/restaurant to go 100% gluten free. Richard has eaten there and enjoyed it.

Turkish Orange and Almond Cake

This recipe for a moist, gluten free Turkish cake, packed full of orangey goodness and flavour, was created by Di Clark. It is reproduced with permission from the November edition of Sussex Living, who would welcome feedback from anyone baking it. Ingredients:

4 large oranges, 6 eggs, 200g caster sugar, 1 tsp baking powder, 280g ground almonds, Juice from 1 lemon

Method:

1. Cover oranges with cold water in a saucepan. Bring to the boil, cover and simmer for 1 hour. Drain and leave until completely cold. Cut into quarters, remove pips and process in a food processor to a pulp. Add eggs, sugar and lemon juice. Process for 1 minute, then add baking powder and ground almonds. Pulse to mix.

2. Pour into a well-greased round cake tin. Bake in a preheated oven at 180C/gas mark 4 for 50-60 minutes or until golden.

3. To serve, dust with icing sugar and orange zest or top with orange liqueur and whipped cream if you wish to serve as an 'adult dessert'! As an accompaniment, fresh raspberries go very well.

Gold award for Fish Factory

Maggie let us know about a recent write up in the local press concerning Fish Factory being the only winner in the South of England at the UK finals of 'Free From Eating Out' awards. The

awards are run by the largest gluten free organisation in the country. Maggie said she had never heard them, but found their website interesting (<u>www.freefromeatingout.co.uk</u>) Fish Factory received a Gold award and the judges report on their visit was glowing: "Excellent reception; they have a huge dedicated menu to hand and we felt really welcome. The food was excellent. Beer batter very, very light and crunchy; the chips had skin on and looked home-made. The home-made bread roll was rather cakey but the baked cheese cake was fantastic and you would never know it was GF. Amazing value for money, especially when their fish is sustainable and their menu is so broad."

Chip shop closure

Bill has advised that The Dolphin Fish & Chip shop in East Worthing has closed, it will re-open but we don't know if they will do GF.
