Points discussed

Structure of group

Changing structure of group from a community group to a Local Group with full committee. All members attending agreed to the new format of the group.

Group funding

We need to communicate to all our new families that our group does not receive any funding from Coeliac UK. Our group has to be totally funded by our Young Wolverhampton Coeliac Group members via entry costs, raffles etc.. At present NICS Wellbeing are funding our room hire costs at **£80 per event** for our first year. If we have to start paying room hire costs, we will need to increase the price of entry, ask for financial donations or do some fundraising events. The bring and share buffet is a good way to keep costs down but we are also conscious that coeliac families always have to take food to events.

Communications

We will continue to use Facebook, Instagram, website and bulk email to communicate with members. Kerry's management of our Instagram page and contacts with suppliers has been key to getting the information about our group to new families. We have also invested in flyers to send to dietitians at local hospitals and to use at community events.

Email communication with members

Due to the way the membership database is created, each Coeliac UK member can only be allocated to one local group. This means that in Wolverhampton, Coeliac UK members are automatically allocated to the Wolverhampton Group and this means we are unable to email Young Wolverhampton Coeliac Group members directly. We book a slot with Coeliac UK and then rely on Coeliac UK to identify parents from all the members on their database from the

Wolverhampton area. Members present felt that our group communications should be sent to all Wolverhampton members not just parents. Any member from Wolverhampton area may know children in the family (coeliac disease can be hereditary) or friends children who have coeliac disease who would like to come along to our child friendly events.

Fundraising:

We discussed many fundraising ideas. We ideally need to run fundraising events which do not cost £80 to rent the room.

Coeliac Awareness Month May – get sponsorship for our Walk along Smestow Valley

September Cooking event – Bake Off competition with £1 fee to enter – all items from the Bake Off to go on the buffet for people to sample

Family quiz/bingo event – maybe in the bar at Woodfield to support Woodfield Raffle at the Christmas Party

Big Draw – how coeliac disease affects me and my family. Display in the Art Gallery, Express and Star, Coeliac UK, social media. Get the older children to curate them.

Awareness month

Encourage our families to get the Coeliac UK pack for children to talk about coeliac disease with their schoolmates. A good opportunity to explain about coeliac disease and cross contamination and why I can't share food or have to be careful because I'm looking after my health.

Online payments to the group

It would be helpful to have a way to pay online to our group for events or donations.

Meal out

Discussed whether to organise a meal for just the parents to give a chance to chat without the children.
